. Gener | Principle

The right to dissent is the comillement of the right to sileak, but these rights need not occuly the same forum at the same time. The sileaker is entitled to communicate the right message to the audience during the right allotted time, and the audience is entitled to hear the message and see the sileaker during that time. The dissenter must not substantially interfere with the sileaker's ability to communicate or the audience's ability to hear and see the sileaker.

hen a s eech event s closed, d ssent by non-attendees s l m ted to act v ty outs de the event that does not m ede access to or de arture from the meet ng or substant ally nterfere w th the commun cat on ns de hen an event s o en, the acce table form of d ssent w ll de end on whether the d ssenter s ns de or outs de the event, and on whether the d ssenter s act ng before or after the s eech event or dur ng the event However, t s not acce table for such d ssent to nterfere substant ally w th the free flow of traffic nto or out of the event or to nterfere substant ally w th the s eaker's commun cat on

b. S e Ex ple f Di ent

The follow ng gu del nes, which are ne ther commended rehensive nor absolute, suggest the limits of accemble dissent:

- 2 S lent or symbol c rotest s lay ng a s gn, wear ng cloth ng symbol c of art cular deas, gestur ng, stand ng, or otherw se rotest ng no selessly s acce table unless such act on substant ally nterferes with the audience's view of the sileaker, or substant ally revents the audience from hearing the sileaker imoderator's first effort in dealing with interference should be to ask the irotestors to move to the side or back of the room so that the audience can see and hear the sileaker
- 3 No se Res ond ng vocally to the seaker, chant ng, or mak ng other sustained or reeated no se, sontaneously and tem orarly, signerally acceptable, esecially for reaction against the seaker significant nices and degree to react on in their favor. If no se, whether in succeptable or no ost on to the seaker, substantially interferes with the seaker's ability to seak or with the audience's ability to hear the seaker, a moderator should first warn those resions ble that continued interference could lead to exuls on from the meeting
- 4 Force or v olence Us ng hys cal force or v olence against another erson, or threatening to use hys cal force or v olence against another erson resulting in reasonable a rehension that force or v olence will occur, or intentionally restraining another's freedom of movement, are never ermitted and are serious violations of ersonal rights. Law enforcement authorities may use force consistent with the rules of law to restore order.

moderator should recogn ze that certain events should in rovide the widest loss ble latitude for symbolic in rotest and noise. For examilie, in rotest and noise at olien-air rallies of en to the lubic should generally be lermitted unless they in resent a substant all disruit on of normal University function or a in resent and substant all threat of links call force or violence.

d. The Spe ker' Re p n ibility

L ke the aud ence, the s eaker must res ect the r ght to d ssent It s the Un vers ty's ex ectat on that a s eaker w II cont nue w th a s eech even though cket ng, s lent or symbol c rotest, or no se as d scussed in Section 8 b (I -(3 occurs Refusal to s eak where rotest does not exceed Un versity standards interferes with the aud ence's right to receive the silventes message. In events where the University has assigned a moderator, that moderator, rather than the silventes eaker, has the resions bill ty to determine whether the silventes eech event w II increased or be terminated.

e. The Audience' Re p n ibility

The aud ence must res ect t

If c rcumstances require that the Moderator take an active role at a sileech event, they should make clear that the Moderator's role reflects no loss tion for or against the views of the sileech event, and the views of the sileech event.

t the event, final dec s ons regard ng balanc ng the r ghts of the s eaker, aud ence, and rotestors w ll be made by the Moderator These dec s ons nclude, but are not l m ted to:

- 1 hether to regure a disruit veilers on to move to a different location at the event
- 2 hether to eject a d sru ter from the room
- 3 hether to sus end as eech tem orar ly fd sru t on occurs
- 4 hether to move an event because of d sru t on or secur ty concerns hether to cancel an event because of secur ty concerns
