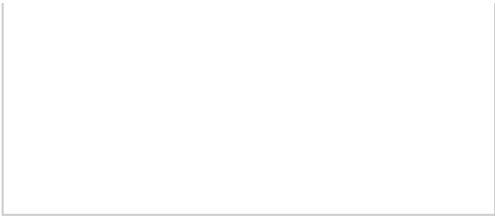

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<p>General Policy</p> <p>Statement of Jurisdiction</p> <p>Student Rights and Responsibilities (Code of Conduct)</p> <p>University Policies</p> <p>How To File A Complaint</p>	<p>Pursuant to the Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York, dated May 11, 1967, a Section 356 of the State Education Law, and after consultation with the President, representatives of the faculty, and students, the Council of the State University of New York at Fredonia establishes and promulgates the following regulations covering the conduct and behavior of students. The following rules and regulations were amended in December 2004 and May 2015. They were approved by the College Council and the President of the University in May 2015.</p> <p>Attendance at this University is a privilege afforded the student by the State of New York and not a legal right. The determination of a student's fitness to be admitted to the university and to continue as a student has been entrusted by the Board of Trustees of the State University to the President and their staff. The term "student" or "students" include all persons taking regular classes at Fredonia, both full-time and part-time, pursuing undergraduate, graduate, or professional studies;</p>

- e. Transferring Fred Car to another person for the purpose of obtaining University services or privileges.
- f. Attempting to obtain a University privilege or service to which the student is not entitled.
- g. Providing false information concerning a change in status concerning a financial refund or financial independence from parents or legal guardian.
- h. Failing to provide accurate information regarding the local address, residency, or contact information.

2. Interference with the Health, Safety, or Rights of Other Persons

All members of the University community share the responsibility for protecting and maintaining the health, safety, and the rights of other persons. Students are required to obey the statutes and laws of the state, as well as the ordinances and laws of the village of Freeport, city of DuKirk, and the town of Pmfret and DuKirk. Conviction for violation of such laws, statutes, or ordinances may be grounds for suspension or expulsion / dismissal.

The following conduct is prohibited:

- a. Failing to comply with reasonable directives of University representatives (This includes, but is not limited to faculty, staff, Residence Hall Director, Resident Assistant, security, safety, fire officials, or police officers carrying out properly assigned responsibilities).
- b. Failing to comply with the final decision of a judicial or administrative action.
- c. Misusing safety equipment including but not limited to tampering with fire equipment, fire alarms, smoke detectors, exit lights, refusal to obey a fire alarm,

g. Possessing firearms, explosives (including firecrackers), weapons, bb guns, paintball guns, paint guns, bl w guns, knives (including switchblade), bayonets, darts, darts, brass knuckles, and any guns that look like real guns.

h. Illegally using, possessing, selling, or distributing narcotics, prescription drugs, stimulants, depressants, hallucinogens, marijuana and its derivatives, or drug paraphernalia. This is more particularly describe in the University Policy Drugs and Alcohol and the Residence Life Policies and Procedures.

i. Illegally using alcohol, possessing alcohol, selling or distributing alcohol; distributing alcohol to minors. Conduct relating to the use of alcohol where the individual becomes disruptive to the community is prohibited, regardless of the age. This is more particularly describe in the University Policy Drugs and Alcohol and the Residence Life Policies and Procedures.

j. Spiking a party that violates local or state laws, ordinances, or jeopardizes the health and safety of students or others.

k. Use of speakers or other sound amplifying equipment without approval as to time and place from the Office of Student Affairs, Campus Life, and/or Residence Life.

l. 1. Posting posters, handbills, or notices without permission of the appropriate University official. The Office of Campus Life must approve all postings.
