Freedom to Demonstrate: Campus Demonstration Protocol Updated August 9, 2023

The following Campus Demonstration Protocol is intended to protect Tulane community members' freedom of expression, protest, and demonstration, while ensuring the safety of all members and operations of the university community from disruption to teaching, research, administrative procedures, and other activities.

Privileges and Responsibilities

Hosting: the privilege of hosting and/or organizing demonstrations on Tulane property is reserved for Tulane

Amplified sound includes, but is not limited to, microphones and bullhorns; and is allowable during the following days/times:

- o Monday-Friday: 11:00am-10:00pm in Pocket Park,
- o Saturday: 12:00pm -10:00pm in Pocket Park, McAlister Plaza, Academic Quad,
- o Sunday: 12:00pm -7:00pm in Pocket Park, McAlister Plaza, Academic Quad.

Signs: placards, signs, and banners constructed from poster board or of other similar paper material are all allowable. Participants may not use placards constructed from material of a hard substance. RSOs and students may check availability for supplies to

Tulane community members who disrupt individuals' freedom of speech, safety, and/or the university's ability to carry out its mission will be held accountable as outlined specifically in section VII.A.2, as well as VII.A.13 - 15, VII.A.18 of the Student Code of Conduct.
