

NYU's Guidance and Expectations on Student Conduct

NYU is, first and foremost, a place of teaching
and learning.

as well as examples of conduct that may violate

other provisions of our student conduct policy

including our prohibitions on cheating and

abusive behavior, destruction of property

disorderly conduct, failure to comply with fire safety

guidelines, misrepresentation, misuse of

University facilities, weapons and residence co-

ndition policies, etc.

The University's Non-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy and Procedures for

Students (the "NDAH" or "NDAH Policy") is

grounded in our legal obligations. U.S. civil rights

laws, including Title VI, Title IX, and Section 504,

prohibit that anyone should be excluded from

participation in or denied the benefits of or

otherwise be subjected to discrimination in our

programs and activities. These laws afford

students these protections regardless of their race

or national origin; their shared ancestry or

ethnicity; their religious identities; their sex

or gender identity; their disability; or other

characteristics covered by law. Our policies, which

apply to all students in all schools and locations,

including Study Away sites and Portal Campuses

– are designed to comply with our obligations

under U.S. and other applicable laws to take

action to address discrimination and harassment.

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits

discrimination and harassment based on a

student's race, color, or national origin. This

applies to students who experience

a gauge of their acceptance of their
association with a religious organization or
identity-related student club.

- Discrimination based on identity, such as refusing
admission to a course or event
- Use or dissemination of derogatory
statements

- Call for genocide or ethnic cleansing
of a group

- Actions taken against someone based on
their field of study, course enrollment, or
study abroad activities could provide

evidence of discriminatory motive for NDAH
if the person ever had access to the office
doors in a particular department tied to the
study of a country or region. Co

B. Behavior during protest activities

The University remains steadfast in its commitment to academic freedom and affirms the right of all NYU community members to peacefully protest, to dissent and to protest

building rules, rules of fire safety and

NYC laws and regulations, and following the

decisions of Campus Safety or other University

affiliated units to prevent from becoming unsafe

- Peacefully protesting on University property is permitted so long as you do not disrupt or interfere with the regular operation of University activities or otherwise violate University policies such as the NDAH.
- If your activities become loud or disruptive, Campus Safety Officers or other University administrators may ask you to relocate, lower your volume, or discontinue your activity if you are required to do so.
- All protesters are to please follow the direction of Campus Safety Officers and other University staff. This includes temporarily removing a mask or showing your NYU ID for identification purposes.

- Subject to the limitations regarding classroom and academic activities as set forth in #4 below, with the exception of affixing messaging or anything else permitted so long as the poster does not violate the NDAH.
- Displaying movie trailers in classrooms may be permitted with prior approval from the [Office of the Dean of Students](#), subject to building-specific rules.
- Displaying student organization logos at University buildings or structures is not permitted without prior approval from the [Office of the Dean of Students](#).

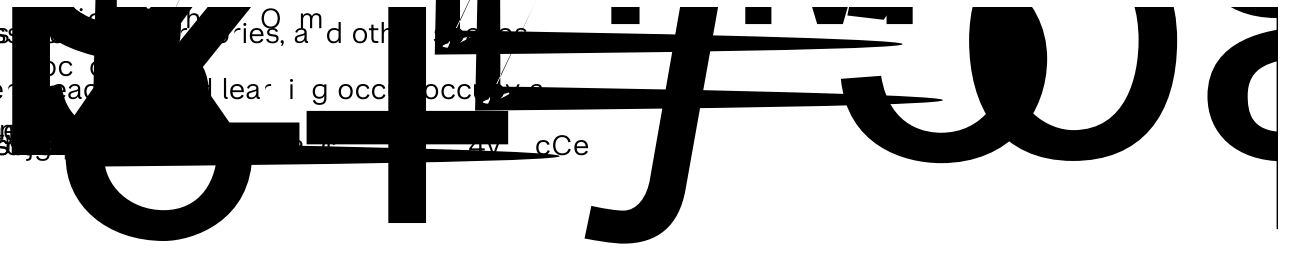
